 U.S. racial or Hispanic minority groups, 3 hours: Choose one course: *HIST 1050 Introduction to Black History; SOCI 2060 Multicultural Issues; ENGL 2470 Introduction to Womens Literature, PHIL 2200 Introduction to Comparative Religions*
